## **Severe Food Allergies Procedures & Guidelines**

The most important aspect of the management of students with life-threatening allergies is avoidance.

For students with food allergies:

- 1. Students should not share or trade food or eating utensils with others.
- 2. Students with food allergies may purchase lunch in the cafeteria but it is safest to pack and eat lunches from home.
- 3. Parents/Guardians of students with severe allergies will be referred to the School Lunch Coordinator for information on ingredients of foods served in the cafeteria so that parents/guardians may determine which foods are safe for their children to consume.
- 4. It is recommended that students with food allergies have snacks sent from home to eat in the event of a school celebration or special occasion. Snacks and treats brought in by others should not be eaten by students with food allergies until the food is cleared by his/her parents/guardians.
- 5. It is recommended that all students wash hands before and after eating.
- 6. An allergen-free table will be made available in the cafeteria when necessary. (The school cannot guarantee the absence of specific foods.)
- 7. Cafeteria tables will be cleaned after each lunch period.
- 8. Food consumption will not be allowed on school buses unless necessary (e.g., a student with diabetes).
- 9. The parent/guardian will provide the school with a completed Allergy Action Plan that includes parental permission and a physician order annually on or before the first day of school.
- 10. The parent/guardian will complete an allergy history annually on the Student Emergency Information form and will notify the school nurse of any changes in the student's health.

- 11. The parent/guardian will provide the school with necessary medications, such as Benadryl, or an Epinephrine Auto-Injector, to be used in the event of a severe allergic reaction or anaphylaxis.
- 12. For safety reasons, the student may be excluded from school if the proper information and medication are not obtained from the parent/guardian as requested.
- 13. Students will be permitted to carry and self-administer an Epinephrine Auto-Injector in an emergency with physician and parent/guardian permission, if the student is deemed responsible by the parent/guardian, physician and school authorities and demonstrates to the school nurse the knowledge and ability to self-administer. Permission to carry the Epinephrine Auto-Injector may be rescinded if the student acts irresponsibly in caring for the Epinephrine Auto-Injector.
- 14. Necessary medications, including Epinephrine Auto-Injectors, will be taken on field trips.
- 15. Information and education regarding a student's allergy will be shared with appropriate school personnel.
- 16. Classmates will receive education about the allergy as deemed necessary and appropriate by the school nurse in collaboration with the parents/guardians.
- 17. Teasing, bullying or harassing of a student with a known allergy by other students will not be tolerated.
- 18. In an emergency, school personnel will accompany the child to the hospital.
- 19. A Section 504 Accommodation Plan will be created for individual students on an as needed basis.
- 20. For students with severe surface contact allergies, allergy-free classrooms will be provided when there is a medically documented need.
