Whereas the World Health Organization has declared an end to the COVID-19 Health Emergency as of May 11, 2023, the Renaissance Academy Charter School seeks to continue implementing those measures necessary or recommended to ensure the health and safety of staff, students, and visitors on our campus.

This plan continues to ask the question: How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The LEA will comply with current mandates as prescribed by PA DOH / PDE.

The LEA will continue to follow the recommendations of the CDC where applicable to a school setting.

COMMUNICATION:

The LEA will regularly communicate and update the community on cases of COVID-19 or other highly communicable illnesses if the administration deems the transmission rate has disrupted learning. Examples of this will include but are not limited to a need to enact the Emergency Time usage allowance as granted by PDE.

The LEA will no longer maintain a public dashboard of Renaissance-specific, confirmed COVID-19 cases but will communicate with individuals when necessary.

SANITATION:

The LEA will maintain current sanitation and HVAC filtration levels per the RACS Sanitation Policy <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Environmental Cleaning and Disinfection Policy 2020</u>, including but not limited to readily available hand sanitizer, cleaning wipes, face coverings, and gloves made available to staff and students who require/request them.

The LEA will educate and support students, post PSAs, and make reminders regarding proper handwashing, sanitation, hygiene, etc.

The LEA will require training in proper Sanitation for facilities staff and appropriate training in mask hygiene not specific to COVID-19 but under best practices as covered by the aforementioned policy. Cleaning.

<u>Disinfecting, and Ventilation | CDC</u>

FACE COVERINGS:

The LEA will comply with CDC Guidelines and current County recommendations regarding face coverings.

The LEA will be a mask-optional setting unless mandated otherwise by DOH, PDE, or other authority.

The LEA will make approved face coverings available should a school community member need / request a face covering.

Exceptions to face-covering requirements will be for persons under the age of 2 years old or those for whom ADA / 504 Accommodations are required and documented.

OTHER MITIGATION TO REMAIN POST WOH Declaration:

- Contractors or outside vendors are permitted to wear masks while on campus See above regarding Face Covering updates.
- Late arrival or early departure of K-12th Grade Students occurs at the Upper School Main Office only.
- Adults picking up students will remain in the outer vestibule or their vehicle until the student arrives for pick-up
- An already established isolation space will be used for any student who is ill at school.
- Use of Electronic Hall Pass to diminish student traffic and monitor student movement.
- Planning for remote learning periods should community transmission become problematic per the approved Emergency Time Plan (>20% population impacted)
- Cooperation with District Transportation as needed.

How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the student's academic needs and students and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, including student health and food services?

The LEA will invest in and plan for the increased needs of staff and students, both academic, social, and otherwise. The LEA will provide support through additional staff, programs, and training around mental health education, social reacclimating to onsite learning, and academic remediation as needed.

The LEA will plan and develop strategies for assessing the needs of students as well as how to address those needs logically and over the next several school years.

The LEA will use allocated funds to invest resources in creating and establishing programs and providing staff to provide emotional and academic support as determined necessary.
